Results of TTA Site Survey

The ASU "BWC and Protests" Survey



- Survey link emailed to 426 current and former TTA sites
 - Sent out June 11, 2020
 - Reminders June 18, June 25
- 53 returned email addresses (373)
- 100 completed surveys returned
 - Response rate = 23.5% (100/426) or 26.8% (100/373)
- 61 from agencies less than 100 sworn (small)
- 21 from agencies with 100-499 sworn (medium)
- 18 from agencies with more than 500 sworn (large)





- Prevalence of protests (since May 25, 2020)
- Civility of protests
- BWC presence
- Activation/live-streaming
- Problems/issues with BWCs (battery life/recording capacity)
- Usefulness of BWCs

Prevalence of Protests (and BWCs)









BWC Performance at Protests







The Civility of Protests: 1 (very peaceful) - 10 (very violent) BODY-WORN CAMERA FRANCIA ASSISTANCE

All	3.84
Small agencies <100	2.91
Medium-sized agencies 100-499	4.13
Large agencies >500	5.94

Are BWCs useful at protests?



- 81% say "yes"
 - Small agencies: 59%
 - Medium-sized agencies: 77%
 - Large agencies: 85%
- Most commonly identified benefits
 - Evidentiary/documentation (75%)
 - Small agencies: 63%
 - Medium-sized agencies: 80%
 - Large agencies: 77%
 - Just as useful as for everyday activities (15%)
 - Small agencies: 16%
 - Medium-sized agencies: 20%
 - Large agencies: 8%

Other Findings of Interest



- 50% sent officers to protests in other jurisdictions
 - Small agencies: 52%
 - Medium-sized agencies: 52%
 - Large agencies: 39%
- 81% require activation of BWC at protests
 - Small agencies: 86%
 - Medium-sized agencies: 69%
 - Large agencies: 71%
- Live-streaming was rare (3% overall)
- 18% reported having complaints filed against officers
 - Small agencies: 0%
 - Medium-sized agencies: 22%
 - Large agencies: 67%

Summary



- Most have had recent protests (75%)
 - Protests more common (95%) and more violent in medium-sized agency jurisdictions.
 - Complaints against officers also more common (22% v. 0%).
- Most had BWCs present at those protests (88%)
 - All medium-sized; 79% small agencies
- Most require activation of BWCs at protests (81%)
 - Less common among medium-sized agencies (69%)
- Most reported no problems with their BWCs (80%)
- Most reported BWCs are useful at protests (81%)
 - Less common among small agencies (59%)
