



BWCPIP Training and Technical Assistance

The Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Training and Technical Assistance (TTA) Program offers several means of supporting the Bureau of Justice Assistance's (BJA) BWC Policy and Implementation Program (BWCPIP) grantees to achieve their BWC program goals and desired outcomes. TTA is also available to agencies that are not BWCPIP grantee when the topic is relevant and resources are available to address those agencies' needs.

Targeted Technical Assistance	Focused technical assistance sessions, provided either virtually or during an on-site visit at the request of BWCPIP grantees or non-grantees.	
Comprehensive Policy Review	A collaborative process with agencies to assess the comprehensiveness of BWC policy, to understand local issues that influence policy (e.g. specific state regulations), and to identify areas for continued technical assistance. The Policy Review Scorecard assesses comprehensiveness across 9 different areas. Peer-to-Peer Exchanges	Agencies are connected to each other to share best practices and lessons learned on specific BWC implementation issues. Peer-to-peer exchanges can take place on-site, remotely, or at technical assistance workshops, conferences, or other meeting venues. Speakers' Bureau	The Speakers' Bureau connects BWC subject matter experts (SMEs) with grantees, associations and agencies that request a speaker at an organized state, local, or tribal event.	Help the grantee discuss their BWC program with external entities, including criminal justice partners, stakeholders, and the community
Regional Workshop	Workshops that address a topic of regional significance for which agencies would most benefit from coordinating with entities within their geographical areas of responsibility.	 State legislation Governor's orders Public release laws
SME Consultation	Ongoing contact and consulting with nationally recognized SMEs matched with BWC sites based on each agency's BWC project plan and strategies or specific needs.
